











Chiefs record best mark in school history; reach the Final Four

When the dust finally settled on the Morningside Chiefs' 1982-83 basketball season, it took some time for their fans and faithful to realize just how great their accomplishments had been. Among the firsts and records established by this year's team were: most wins in a single season, 26; best record ever, 26-6; first North Central Conference Holiday Tournament Championship; most regular-season wins, 23; first ever initiation to the NCAA Division II post-season basketball tournament; first time ever chosen as host for the NCAA Division II regional; first ever NCAA Division II Quarterfinal appearance; first ever appearance in the NCAA Division II Final Four; first ever rating in the NCAA Division II Top Twenty

Other records established by the squad were: most points scored in a single season, 2503 (erasing the old mark of 2301 set in 1975); most field goals scored in a single game (tie), 45 vs. Mankato State; highest free throw percentage single game (tie), 100 percent (5-5) vs. Northern Colorado; most NCC wins single-season, 15; most field goals NCC single-season, 580; and most points NCC single-season, 1414.

Head Coach Dan Callahan was selected North Central Region Coach of the Year for 1983 in Division II. Junior forwards Bob Beneke and Steve Brandsma were chosen first team All-North Central Conference, and first team All-North Central Region. Both Brandsma and Beneke were named to the All-North Central Regional team, with Beneke being named the MVP of the tourney. Last, but not least, the Chiefs wrapped up their first NCC title since 1951, and their first outright title since 1947 by finishing the regular season with a 15-3 record, 23-5 overall.




Softball team finishes 8-2, lo-Kota Conference co-champs






