#### CHIEF WAR EAGLE

WAR EAGLE, A SANTEE SIOUX INDIAN WAS BORN DURING THE 1780'S IN MINNESOTA OR, WISCONSIN, IN THE EARLY YEARS OF THE 1800S, THE SANTEE PEOPLE LIVED IN SOUTH EASTERN MINNESOTA WHEN TENSIONS BUILT UP BETWEEN THE INDIAN PEOPLE AND THE WHITE SETTLERS, THE SANTEE FLED WESTWARD AND SETTLED AT THE CONFLUENCE OF THE BIG SIOUX AND MISSOURI RIVERS.

THE YANKTON TRIBE LIVED IN THE AREA INTO WHICH THE SANTEE PEOPLE CAME WAR EAGLE WAS ADOPTED INTO THE YANKTON TRIBE THE HEAD CHIEF, LITTLE DISH, LATER CHOSE WAR EAGLE TO SUCCEED HIM AS THE HEAD CHIEF, APPROXIMATELY IN 1830 OR 1831.

THEOPHILE BRUGUIER, A FRENCH-CANADIAN FUR TRADER, MOVED UP THE MISSOURI RIVER FROM ST. LOUIS INTO WAR EAGLE'S MAIN ENCAMPMENT ALONG THE BIG SIOUX RIVER. BRUGUIER WON THE FRIENDSHIP OF WAR EAGLE AND EVENTUALLY MARRIED WAR EAGLE'S DAUGHTERS.

WITH THE ACTIVE TRADING BUSINESS THAT FLOURISHED BETWEEN THE INDIANS AND THE WHITEMEN IN THE AREA, A VILLAGE GRADUALLY DEVELOPED. SOON LAND SPECULATORS ACQUIRED TRACTS AND BEGAN ESTABLISHING SIOUX CITY


CHIEF WAR EAGLE DIED IN 1851 AND HIS BODY WAS PUT TO REST ON THIS BLUFF OVERLOOKING SIOUX CITY, WHERE THE BIG SIOUX AND THE MISSOURI RIVERS CONVERGE.

CHIEF WAR EAGLE HAD A LINGERING INFLUENCE AND WAS RESPONSIBLE FOR THE FAVORABLE RELATIONS THAT DEVELOPED BETWEEN THE REC MEN AND THE WHITEMEN UNDER HIS LEADERSHIP AND HUMANITARIAN ACTS, WAR EAGLE WAS CREDITED WITH THE INITIAL ESTABLISHMENT OF SIOUX CITY

Vien nominated his parents who were then chosen by a panel of students and college staff members.




