





The 1991-1992 school year was full of entertainment news both on campus and nationally.

On campus, the Morningside Theater Department presented two plays. In the fall, Bruce Bunger presented Henrick Ibsen's "A Doll House" (see pp. 104-105), and Bette Skewis stepped into the director's spot in the spring for "The Miser." (pp. 108-109)

Early in the school year Breneisen was invited as a member of a group of 24 American college professors as a representative of the United States through the Secretary of State's office and an organization

called Citizen Ambassadors to review educational practices in China's art

schools. He spent around two weeks in China, leaving November 16 and returning December 1.

His first stop was in

Beijing, then to Shanghai, Xi'an, Guilin, and finally Hong Kong. In these cities he visited universities and art schools and specialty schools designed to teach visual arts and performing arts in Shanghai and Guilin.

One thing about China that really impressed Breneisen were the people who were "very friendly and very responsive to us as a group of people. They were very exciting

people. They were very exciting and very interested in what was going on in the Western world."

Brancisco remembered an

Breneisen remembered an instance when he went into a restaurant asking where the toilet was and receiving instead a block of ice cream, then a cup of tea, and then finally learning where he could find the toilet, much to the embarrassment of the young girls in the restaurant who were trying to help him out.

Breneisen indicated that his trip

benefited him as an artist by allowing him to experience another culture,

and as a teacher by allowing him to gain insight on different ways of educating. He said the art was very conservative,

and that the Chinese art student would learn how to imitate the masters before going on to develop their own style.

Then, right around Easter, Breneisen and five other faculty members made a whirlwind trip to England. Tori Marguesen, Larry Martin, Bette Skewis, and Tim Orwig all went with Breneisen where they spent one day in London, two in Ormskirk and three in Stratford-Upon-Avon. The main goal of this trip was to see about setting up a faculty exchange program with Edge Hill College. Breneisen said that if all went well, an art professor from Edge Hill would teach a semester at Morningside while he taught a semester at Edge Hill. "One professor trading jobs would benefit a lot more students. It would have a much broader impact, but maybe not as indepth as a student going on an exchange program.".

The country's eyes were riveted on the trial circuit this year. The first, the rape trial of William Kennedy Smith. Smith was acquitted of raping Patricia Bowman in a trial that lasted three weeks. The jury deliberated just 77 minutes. CNN covered the trial live for most of the three weeks and included the testimony of Smith, Bowman, and Smith's uncle, Senator Edward Kennedy.

Former Heavyweight Boxing Champ Mike Tyson was also on trial for rape. Tyson stood trial in Indianapolis for the rape of 18 year-old Desiree Washington, a contestant at the time in a beauty pageant. Tyson was found guilty and sentenced to 10 years in a federal correctional facility.

Four Los Angeles police officers stood trial for the beating of Rodney King. The attack by the officers was captured on video tape and used throughout the trial. The officers were found not guilty in April.

The most horrifying of trials took

place last fall in the insanity trial of Jeffrey Dahmer. Dahmer, a Milwaukee man, was charged with the deaths of seventeen young men. Dahmer captured national attention late last summer when police discovered the remnants of several of Dahmer's victims. He reportedly not only killed his victims, but mutilated and ate many of them. Dahmer was found to be sane and is now serving 17 consecutive life sentences without the possibility of parole.•

Since both were there only first semester, their professors had to "make up" things to test them on, usually one essay that was the sum of their grade. Studying and going to classes only took up a fraction of their time, while both admitted that ventured into Soho where the

the social part was the best.

Despite the differences in culture and studies, both Chris and Sheila are glad they went to England.


"I think it helped me grow up quite a bit." Sheila commented.

Only two wins, numerous injuries, Diaz breaks records, many obtain honors

On September 7, 1991, as the Chiefs played Northwestern College, a violent rain and wind storm interrupted play as Morningside was gaining momentum in a game that the Red Raiders were keeping very close. Then the storm struck, ending the Chiefs' momentum and, seemingly, the entire season. Morningside did win that day, 13-7, but managed to win only one more game, a 42-7 drubbing of NCC-opponent South Dakota.

Weather also held the Chiefs from picking up a possible third win when several inches of snow were dumped on the Midwest on October 31st, cancelling a tilt against troubled Augustana College.

Injuries plagued Morningside as they were forced to use three different starting quarterbacks in the first three games.

Jorge Diaz, a senior placekicker, and Anthony Fieldings, a junior inside linebacker, both earned berths on the 1991 All-North Central Conference football team. Diaz broke three Morningside records for kicking including field goals in a game (5 vs. UNO, 1991, also tied the NCC record); field goals in a season (10 in 1990 and 1991); and career field goals (26). Diaz was also named as the placekicker on the Kodak All-America Football Team which selects players from Division II and NAIA Division I teams. Fieldings earned his spot by averaging 15 tackles in the shortened 10-game schedule. He was named team defensive player five times and NCC Defensive Player of the Week once.

Aaron Clark (free safety), Bill Kennedy (punter) and Antone Jones (nose guard) were all placed on the second team. Honorable mentions included Mark Kamies (quarterback), Bruce Borchers (center), Brian Daugherty (guard), Ray Cooling (tight end), Dean Jones (defensive tackle and Scott Griffin (linebacker).

Volleyball sees victory

"Roof!" Every fan was on their feet screaming, clapping, and cheering the Morningside volleyball girls on to victory. With an overall record of 30-10, that is just what Coach Joan McDermott and her Lady Chiefs did. Finishing the season 3rd in the North Central Conference(NCC) with a 6-3 mark, earned Coach McDermott the league's "Coach of the Year," as well as the American Volleyball Coaches Association(AVCA) North Central Region "Coach of the Year," and made her eligible for the national award.

Two players from M-side landed on the twelve member 1991 All-NCC women's volleyball squad. For her second year, sophomore Jill Jackes led the Lady Chiefs to a fourth-seed in the NCC Tournament with 478 kills. This among numerous statistics enabled Jackes to be

named all-tournament in four events: the Nebraska-Omaha Invitational; Central Missouri Challenge; Briar Cliff Invitational; and the Northern Premier Tournament.

Joining Jackes was sophomore Kristen Kofoed - named NCC's Player of the Week on October 21.

Nancy Kogle, the lone senior on the M-side squad, was one of seven players to receive honorable mention. All-American last year, Kogle pointed out that this year was no exclusion to injuries. Freshman Dena Kelly had a sprained ank Jackes played while sick, and Kog played with a hurt hand were just few of the inconveniences.

Contributing to the squad acheivements, was the overa attitude of "It takes more to be winner than just winning." This, and the squad's ability to put it to wo allowed them to finally beat the University of Nebraska Omaha(UNO), at the Norther Premier Tournament. 





Tudehope helps rebuild

Two seasons ago, Morningside Women's Athletics relinquished its dominance in the lo-Kota Conference and ventured into the brutal NCC. The transition was expected to be difficult, but for the women's basketball program in particular, it was devastating. Under two different coaching staffs, the Lady Chiefs toiled at the bottom of the conference standings, compiling a 3-33 record in those two seasons. A change was desperately needed. and Morningside looked no further than across town once again to begin rebuilding.

One year after Joan McDermott left Briar Cliff to transform the Chiefs' volleyball and softball programs, Coach Cindy Tudehope followed suit in hopes of producing the same results on the hardwood. So far, so good.

This season, Morningside finished 14-14 overall and tied for sixth place in the NCC. A major factor contributing to Mornigside's turnaround was the return of junior center, Shawna Paskert, who sat out last season with a knee injury. Paskert led the team in scoring with 16 points per game (ppg), rebounding with 7.6 per game, blocked shots, and steals. Paskert is already the 12th leading rebounder and 15th leading scorer in school history. For her efforts, the 6'2" Emmetsberg, lowa native was named to the First-team All-North Central Conference.

Although Tudehope has built several starting combinations around her 6'2" center, all the Lady Chiefs have made significant contributions to the team's winning ways. Sophomores Colleen Holland and Deb Runde ran the show at point guard with speedy off guards Sloan and Sarah (9.4 ppg) Rolloff as running mates.

Down low, JUCO transfer Dena Kelly made an instant impact, while part-time starters Donalee Johnson and Melinda Howard provided rebounding strength at the forward position. Versatile sophomore Nicole Newberg led the team in free-throw shooting with a dazzling 91%, with Holly Clark, Sue Selland, Michelle Krough, and freshman Amy Schuver solidifying a very deep bench.

With the successful first season under her belt, Tudehope is confident that her team will fare even better the second time around, now that they've become accustomed to her coaching system.


"We were in all of our games except two." Tudehope commented. "There girls are no longer concerned with being competitive, they play to win."



Chiefs excell in NCC

The Morningside Chiefs finished the 1992 campaign with a 21-19 overall record and an 11-6 mark in NCC play, including a 4-1 showing at the conference playoffs. The Chiefs made a great comeback after losing to St. Cloud State in the first round of the double elimination tournament. Morningside went on a four game winning streak, before the title game against SDSU was called because of rain.

Morningside had five players listed on the 1992 All-North Central Conference Baseball Squad which was headed by Steve Drent, the MVP of the NCC.

Joining Drent on the All-NCC team Morningside were senior

outfielder, Brian Uhl, junior infielders, Jayson Grevengood and Todd Henningfeld, and sophomore pitcher, Brad Brunning.

Drent was the NCC's most feared hitter this season, topping the league in five offensive categories and finishing second in two others.

Drent nearly became the first player since 1979 to pull off a Triple Crown by pacing the conference in hitting (.491) and RBI's (24) and finishing second in home runs (5). He also led the NCC in hits (26), walks (11), and total bases (48) while finishing second in doubles (7). Overall, Drent hit .362 for Morningside with nine doubles, seven homers, and 34 RBI's.

Grevengood ranked third in the

league with a .433 average and equalled Drent's mark with 26 hits. He also ranked second in runs scored (18) and total bases (40) and third in doubles (5) and RBI's (16). He is among the top 12 hitters at the NCAA II level with a .457 average.

Henningfeld, also an All-Conference player as a freshman, led the league in runs scored (21) and doubles (8) and was third in hits (24) and fourth in hitting (.414). Uhl hit .333 in league play and .372 overall.

Brunning compiled a 4-1 conference record, including a 4-0 mark against NCC Southern Division foes while going 5-3 overall with a 2.76 ERA. Brunning was named Most Valuable Pitcher in the Southern Division.



At the time the yearbook was sent to press, Pearson and Nedved appeared to have a good chance at being invited to the National Meet with their provisional qualifying times.






Music



Mass Communications




