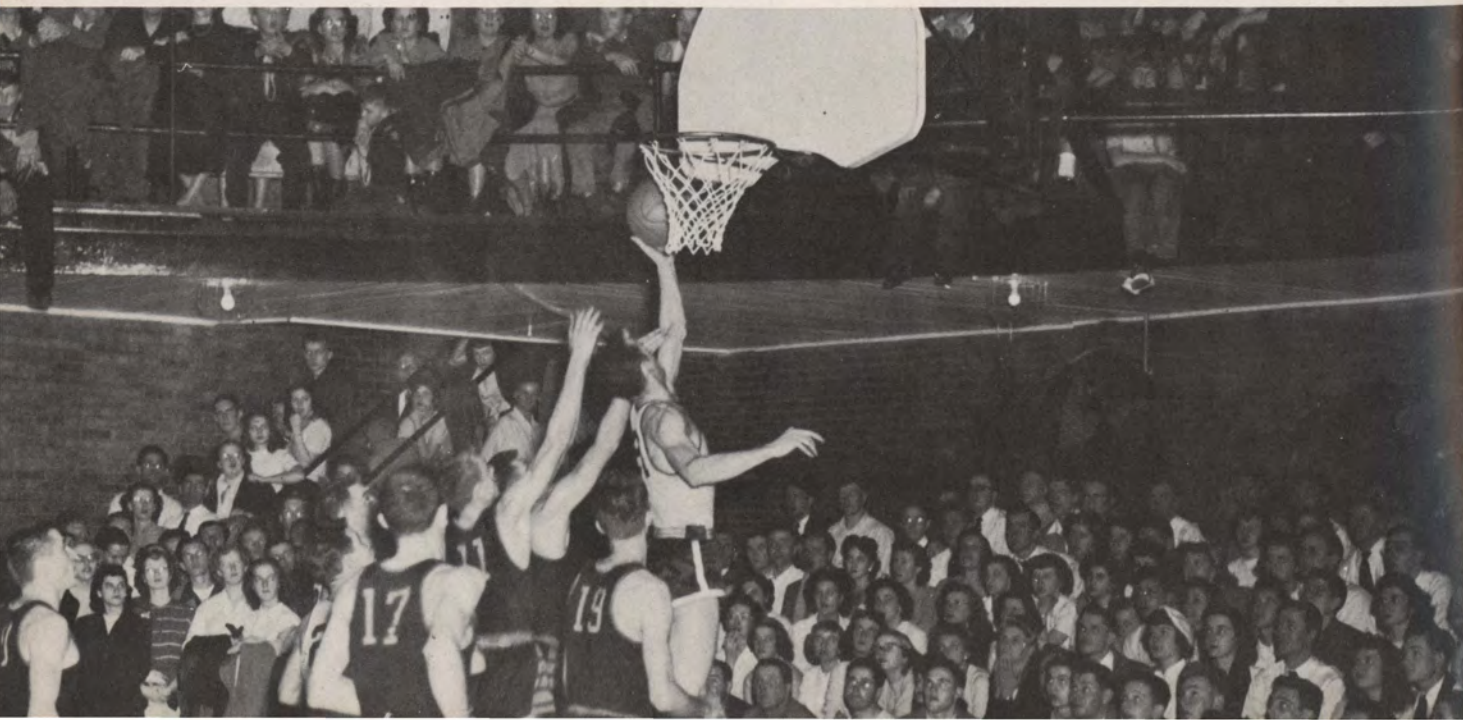


Tip-Off

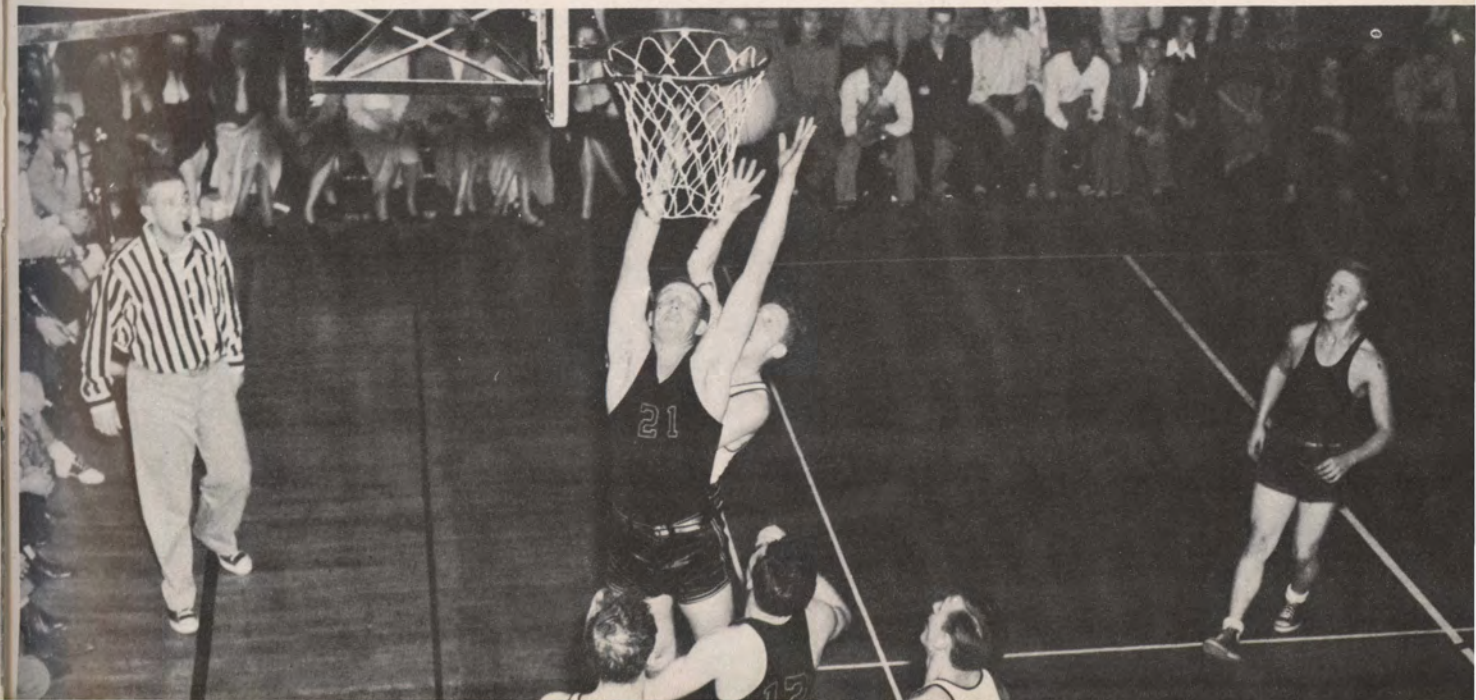

Due to graduation, 4 players will be missing from the squad next year, however, enough potential power remains on the squad to build an interesting team that should give a good account of themselves.

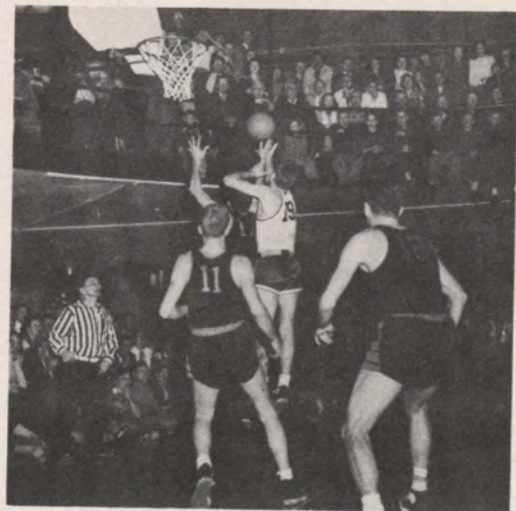

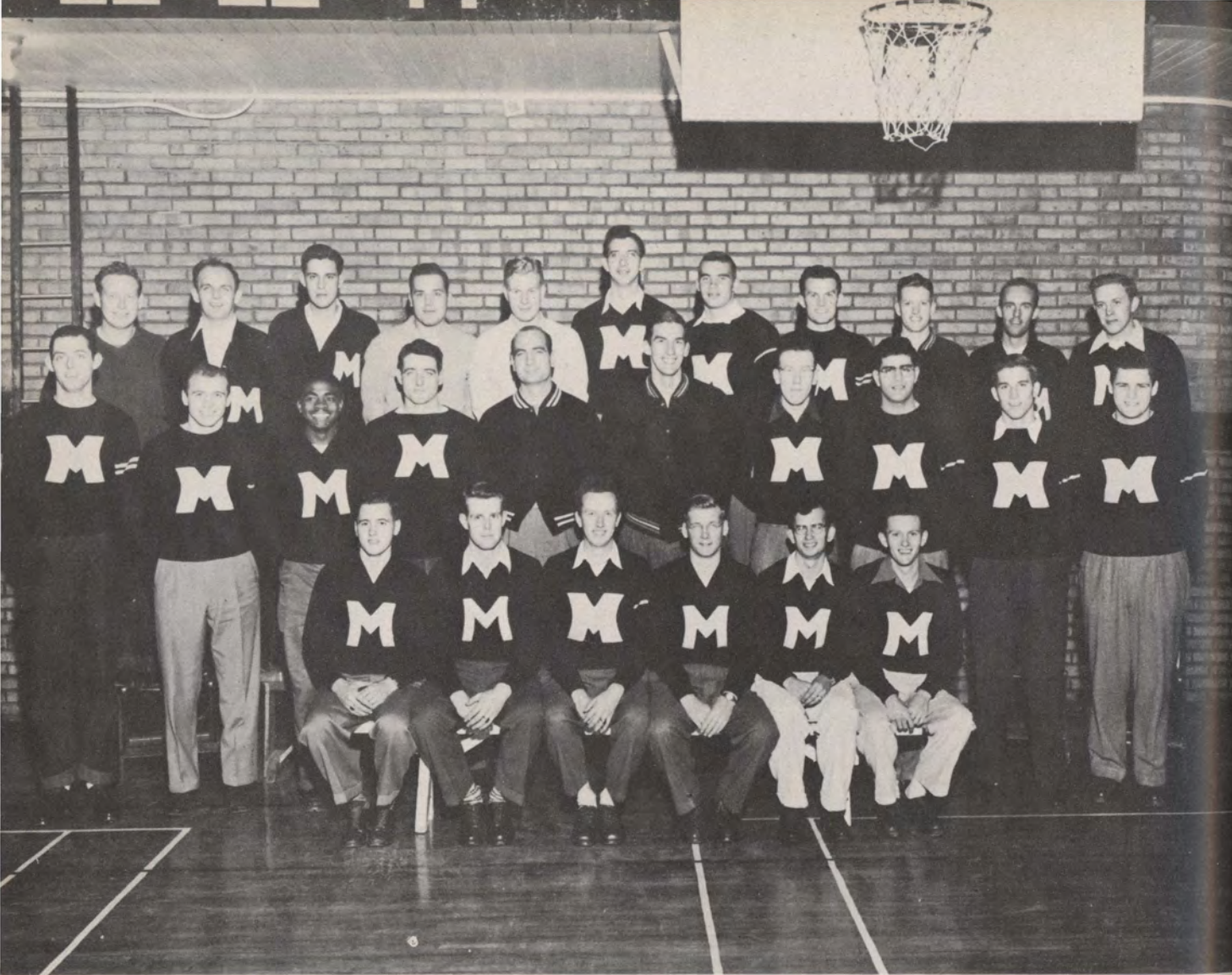
Morningside Players
