Homecoming by Stacey Jones


'Extravaganza' was one of the words used to describe Homecoming 1992 and an extravaganza it was - an "Under the

Chiefs Sink Rabbits: 6-2 by Shane A. Thelen

Chris Hogzett kicked two field goals (from 18 and 34 yards) to keep the Chiefs out in front of the SDSU Jackrabbits, 6-2, to win Morningside's Homecoming, at a muddy Roberts Stadium.

Sloppy field conditions kept both offenses from dominating. There were eight turnovers total, including five fumbles, in the game. As a check to the weather, Head Coach David Dolch pulled out the trick play, and on a punting down, Pat Joyce, the starting left cornerback and a former high school quarterback, was inserted at punter. He threw a 32-yard pass to Mario Myrick for the first

down and three plays later Hogzett chipped in his first field goal.

Kelly Yancy collected his fifth 100-yard rushing game as a Chief and outrushed everyone else in the game combined. Eric Carlson had a big day on defense, charting eight tackles, six solo, and Pre-season All-American, Anthony Fieldings lead the team with 14 tackles. Rich Doty contributed five tackles, an interception, and recovered a fumble.

Although the game wasn't explosive, it provided a Homecoming victory for the Chiefs, who maintained a .500 record for most of the season.

The Morningside men's and women's track teams once again performed well during the indoor season. In head coach Rick Clarahan's fifth year at the helm, both teams fared well at the North Central Conference meet and sent athletes to the NCAA Division II national meet at USD.

At the conference meet in Fargo, North Dakota, both teams had some outstanding individual performances.

On the men's side two runners captured third place finishes. Brad Bartlett raced to a third in the 500 meter dash, and Bret Taber paced himself to the same place in the 5000 meter run.

The women saw two of their numbers place the highest in school Shot putter Julie history. VanOtterloo finished second in that event. The highest placing ever for a Morningside woman in a field event. Half-mile standout Gina DeWitt captured first in the 800 meter run. It was the first time an M'side woman thinclad had ever been crowned conference champion. The teams also fared well nationally. Chad Nedved, Chris Newton, Kent Lundquist, Troy Williams, Bartlett, and DeWitt all qualified for the Indoor Championships. Two others, Taber VanOtterloo, qualified provisionally, but did not make this year's cut.

Nedved, last year's national runnerup, ran well at the meet. However, his time did not qualify for the finals.

The men's 4 X 400 meter relay team of Newton, Lundquist, Williams, and Bartlett finished sixth in the race. The sixth place finish garnered All-American status for all four men.

DeWitt's 800 meter run was the highlight of the Morningside indoor track season. After qualifying for the finals on Friday, DeWitt came back on Saturday to win it all. She managed to race by the leader with 100 meters left and become the first national track champion and female track All-American in Morningside history.






(above) Sarah Rolloff drives in. (right) A pass from Paskert to (far right) Donalee Johnson, who goes for two.





MORNINGSIDE GETS NEW PRESIDENT

Dr. Jerry Israel, Vice President and Academic Dean of Simpson College in Indianola, Iowa for the past four year, has been appointed President of Morningside College. The announcement was made by Roland Junck, Chair of the Morningside College Board of Directors, during a campus news conference on Tuesday, October 20, 1992.

Israel's appointment as the 11th President of Morningside College was given unanimous approval by the college's Board of Directors at their bi-annual meeting held on campus October 19 and 20. Dr. Israel will assume his duties in the spring.

Dr. Israel's appointment concludes an exhaustive nation-wide search for a successor to Dr. Miles Tommeraasen, who will retire in August, 1993, following 15 years as the president of the college. President Tommeraasen and Dr. Israel will work together for a period of time to ensure an orderly transition.

After receiving a B.A. degree from New York University, Dr. Israel earned his Master of Arts Degree from the University of Michigan and was awarded a Ph.D. from Rutgers University. All three degrees are in history. He is also a graduate of Harvard University's Institute for Educational Management.

Putting students first is exemplified by his dedication to classroom instruction and his thorough knowledge of his academic specialty, American History. Dr. Israel was a Visiting Professor at the University of Pittsburgh (1968-70) and Associate Professor at Northern Illinois

University (1970-74). While at Northern Illinois University, Dr. Israel served as an advisor to the Dean of the College of Continuing Education. At Illinois Wesleyan University, he was Chair of the History Department (1974-79), Director of the Social Science Division (1977-80), Associate Dean of the University (1981-88). (Dr. Israel also taught courses at the Illinois Correctional Facility in Statesville and Pontiac from 1971 to 1982.)


In 1988, Dr. Israel took to Simpson College his commitment to students when he accepted the position of Vice President and Academic Dean. Due to his love for the classroom, he continued teaching American and Asian History on a limited basis. According to Chris Dixon, student representative to the Presidential Search Committee, this was one of many factors that lead him to believe that Dr. Israel was the "right choice" for Morningside College. "Dr. Israel's love for teaching and his desire to maintain contact with students in and out of the classroom made the differences. I was particularly impressed that he takes time to eat in the cafeteria and visit with students in their dorm rooms."

Dr. Israel is the author or editor of a number of scholarly and professional books and articles, including two books on America's relationship with China and a book on the role of associations in modern America. His articles have appeared in American Historical Review, Pacific Historical Review and many other scholarly publications throughout the country.



In addition to his academic accomplishments, Dr. Israel has been very active in church and community affairs in various cities. 










