

Message From The President

My father, who is now 82 years old, has a happy philosophy of life, a sense of real security that grows out of an unshakeable faith in the goodness of God. Judging from material blessings, he has never had a reason for such a faith. It can be explained only in terms of that which a man can possess which is other than material. Since I can remember, I have heard him often say: "Life gets better all the time." Yet through my lifetime and most of his, he has never known what might be called **real financial security**. In fact, it has been a hard life. I have watched him make sacrifices in order to secure his education. To appreciate what I mean by sacrifice let me explain that during the part of one winter he lived and slept in a tent near the campus of the South Dakota college he was attending. During the drought and depression years in South Dakota I saw him serve as a poverty stricken country parson, yet I never realized we were poor. His salary the year I was a senior in high school was, as I recall, \$645 — for the year! Later as I went through college and seminary and began my own ministry, I saw him face old age and retirement with the meager pittance provided for retired Methodist preachers. Yet, he always honestly meant it when he said: "Life gets better all the time." And still does!

It has occurred to me that most of you who are in college or are being graduated this year have lived through an entire lifetime of insecurity. Your first recollections are of war and its aftermath. You have heard all your lives of the "cold war", which is yet being waged. You have heard newscasters spreading doom like thick paste over the air. We have been warned of the threats of enemies. After such a life, some of you now leave college intent upon making some positive contribution toward the building of a better world.


I covet for each one of you the ability to honestly say, year by year, "Life gets better all the time." No mere, blind, wishful, "Pollyanna-isin" will produce that experience. I believe there are two qualifications which must be met by those who would really know that life gets better all the time.


First, success must be defined in terms of spiritual growth. A meaningful working relationship with God, a worthy purpose for all of life, an unquestionable moral code, and an awareness of nobility within will help us find immer peace and strength. Real success in life is measured by our growth toward such goals.

Secondly, security must be thought of in terms of integrity. Individuals do not fear those whom they can trust. Nor do nations build defenses against other nations which they can trust. Our security will result first, from making certain our lives are worthy of the trust of others, and then working through all the available agencies to help the peoples of the earth to understand one another and to be worthy of mutual trust.

I hope your college years have helped you to appreciate such a point of view. It will not prevent physical or mental pain, but the faith that produces such a philosophy of life will give you strength to endure and to find good joyous reasons for living. Nor will such a belief grant you material security or any of the other freedoms we love, but you will find a growing sense of inner peace as you use every available source to help build lasting security for our age and our posterity.

It is my prayer that each of you will find a faith that will make you know: "Life gets better all the time."

Into the heaven of freedom, my Father, let my country awake."


What Tagore desires for his country we desire for ours. Such a heritage has been handed down to us. Ours is the task to prepare ourselves to be creative contributors to that heritage.

Sigma Kappa ...


Sigma Kappa is one of the five oldest sororities, having been founded at Colby College in 1874. We are proud that it was the first Greek letter sorority to be founded in New England. While many Greek letter sororities had their origin in early literary groups, Sigma Kappa was in the beginning what it is now—an organization of college women to promote service, cultural development, spiritual standards, high scholarship and intellectual life among its many thousand members.

The first emblem worn by members was a ring. The second was a monogram of which the present pledge pin is a replica. In 1894 the badge as worn by Sigmas all over the world was adopted. Sigma Kappa colors are lavender and maroon and the sorority flowers is the violet.

The badge is a triangle enclosing a lyre and displaying letters MØE, one on each side of the triangle. The greek letters Phi Zeta, the name of Morningside's chapter, are shown on the guard pictured.

Football

A successful record was the result of a hard fought football season. The record, of four wins, one loss and one tie, placed the Maroons second in the North Central Conference. The crown was won by South Dakota State, whose record in the conference play was marred only by a 7-7 tie with Morningside.

The high spirit of the Morningside fans following the team was an asset to the rampaging Maroons. This spirit was evident in the homecoming game with Iowa State Teachers' College. In the first quarter a 13-play, 55 yard drive resulted in the first Morningside tally. The Tutors lost the ball on downs on the Maroon 18 in the second quarter, and on the first play from scrimmage Rusty Mohler took a handoff from quarterback Reynders and raced 82 yards, with excellent blocking, for a second T. D. In the fourth period, a punt blocked by the powerful Maroon line resulted in the final score, of 21-7.

"The Little Seers"





The day is climaxed at the traditional evening dance, at which time the May Queen is announced.




